District Goals

The Board of Education sets goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2022-2023 are:

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade/Course Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade/Course Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

School Goals

McIntosh County Middle School's Goals for 2022-2023 are to improve students':

- Competency and achievement in all GMAS-tested areas.
 - MCMS will increase the percentage of students scoring at "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels and higher 5% across the board.
- Lexile levels
 - Will increase so that 78% of our students are reading at or above grade level as measured by our Spring benchmark and GMAS.

School/Teacher Responsibilities

The 6th, 7th, and 8th grade teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in mastering the *Georgia Standard of Excellence* in all academic areas.

- Encouraging reading and the use of reading programs (Accelerated Reader and Achieve 3000) at home.
- Having students use Math IXL for independent practice at home.
